

# First Peoples Writers Workshop - Guidelines

#### Essentials

#### About this Program

The First Peoples Writers Workshop is an initiative committed to elevating and nurturing Victorian First Peoples creatives within the screen industry. This workshop is targeted for First Peoples writers, to help fast track their professional development as a screenwriter by giving them the tools to craft and refine their story ideas to take to market or a producer.

The successful applicants will learn from experienced industry professionals how to craft an efficient and effective pitch document that accurately represents the intended vision for their project. Successful applicants will also be given the opportunity to refine their own story idea with the guidance of industry professionals.

The workshop will take place in Shepparton, over three and a half days (with an extra half day allocated for travel). It will provide Melbourne-based applicants an opportunity to creatively develop their work in a new environment, while also giving regional Victorians more opportunities to engage with VicScreen.

### Key Details

- Deadline for submissions 5pm Monday 2 October 2023
- Applicants notified by Friday 20 October 2023
- Workshop will be held Friday 17 November till Monday 20 November 2023
- Shepparton Venue to be confirmed.

Successful applicants must be available to attend the workshop in-person. Accommodation will be provided by VicScreen. Lunch will be provided on each day of the Workshop and participants will receive a small allowance as a contribution towards other costs.

Applicants will be required to organise their own travel. If you require any travel assistance, please let us know.

### Who is eligible?

The program is open to aspiring Victorian writers/producers who identify as First Peoples and can demonstrate experience in story development across fiction or factual for any genre, platform, or narrative art-form. The experience can be professional, community cultural development, semi-professional, independent or fringe work.





Applicants must also meet any relevant eligibility requirements, as set out in VicScreen's <u>Terms of Trade</u>.

#### What do you need to apply?

- · Complete the online application form and provide the below supporting documentation:
  - One paragraph bio
  - Story idea (half page)
  - Personal statement outlining career objectives and how these workshops will help advance their careers in the Screen industry
  - Previous writing sample (script excerpt, article/review on a film/TV show, book chapter etc.)

## What happens after you apply?

 Your application will be assessed by a panel of VicScreen representatives. Selection will be made against the *Assessment Criteria* listed below:

## Assessment Criteria

- Previous experience in story development.
- Strength, distinctiveness and quality of the narrative within the submitted materials.
- Commitment to the screen industry and passion for the production of screen stories as a longterm career objective.
- Objectives for undertaking the workshops, including how it will assist their career development and what specific skills they expect to gain from the experience.

# How long until a decision is made?

You can expect a decision within 4 weeks from the deadline date, via email or phone.

# What will help your application?
